MYTHS about Domestic Violence

Myth: "It's just a row...all couples have them."

FACT: Domestic violence is a serious crime that includes physical assault, cruelty, verbal abuse, rape, and sexual assault of women. It can lead to physical injury, hospitalisation, mental health issues. No behaviour which degrades and violates a human being in this way can be dismissed as "just a row".

Domestic violence is a social problem, not a private problem.

Myth: "It's her own fault...she had it coming."

FACT: No woman "deserves" to be abused. Blaming his behaviour on someone or something else - a woman, his relationship, his childhood, ill-health, alcohol or drug addiction - is an **abuser's way of avoiding personal responsibility for his actions**.

Myth: "It can't be that bad or she'd leave."

FACT: Women stay with violent men because it is extremely difficult to leave. No one enjoys being beaten. Women face many barriers when trying to leave an abusive relationship. Many women are frightened of the abuser, do not know how to get away, may not have the financial ability to travel far, or a number of other reasons which make leaving harder than most think.

It is possible to escape an abusive relationship. All of the resources listed here were created to help women. Myth: "He's just going through a hard time, once he finds work it will stop."

FACT: Economic hardship does not cause domestic violence. Women's Aid reports that 1 in 7 women in Ireland have experienced some form of domestic abuse, regardless of the economic condition. The abuser may start to use unemployment or financial difficulties as an excuse for the abuse.

There is no excuse for abuse and the abuser is solely responsible for his actions, no matter what his financial condition.
