

WHO WE ARE?

New Communities Partnership (NCP) is a national umbrella network of migrant led groups in Ireland. Our membership comprises community and voluntary groups from Asian, Middle Eastern, North African, European, the Caribbean, South American and African backgrounds.

OUR HISTORY

Our network was formed in 2003 by a group of community leaders who wished to represent and empower ethnic minorities and their organizations in Ireland. Though member groups' backgrounds varied widely, they shared the common goal of striving to overcome the obstacles and difficulties that arose for people building a new life in Ireland.

NCP opened it's first office in Dublin in 2005 and established offices in Cork and Limerick in 2006.

Deliver **training** that enhances the capacity and leadership development of ethnic minorities in Ireland.

Develop and sustain strategies to increase the **economic integration** of ethnic minorities across Ireland.

Citizenship Application Support Service

Free citizenship application support service with national helpline and drop in clinics. (See www.newecommunities.ie for drop in clinic locations)

EM-Cubate

Ireland's first ethnic-minority business incubation programme. The programme guides entrepreneurs and potential entrepreneurs in Ireland who wish to start or develop their own business.

Intercultural Liaison Volunteers (ILV's)

ILV's are community activists, who after a period of training, act as link between migrant communities and local authorities. Their role is to assist service users and service providers within local authority housing estates to work together and engage in conflict resolution procedures.

Migrant Writers & Performing Artists Ireland

Migrant Writers and Performing Artists Ireland serves as a creative platform for bringing together migrant artists living in Ireland.

NCP Women's Space

A space in Dublin for migrant women to link with other migrant women. Women are welcome to come along on the first Friday of each month to talk, learn, network, study, and seek advice.
